# 1. A Note From The Executive Director

As the year draws to a close, we want to express our gratitude to the Lord for what He enabled us to accomplish and look forward to considerable progress in 2026 and beyond.

The last 4 years have indeed been our groundwork beginnings. We reached out to more than 100 church leaders, introducing the SaveOne ministry in their congregations. Between 2023 and 2024, we reached almost 200 churches through emails and phone calls, hoping for a big church leader's presence at the Summit 24 which was hosted in Katlehong on the Change Bible Church premises. We reached out to some NGOs and university campuses. The response was minimal. But we are grateful to and for everyone who responded positively. We look forward to a progressive 2026, understanding that the Lord is at work and holding our hands. We end the year with three congregations that have trained facilitators to run the ministry and one chapter within the Pregnancy Network. A quick check on the web showed two more chapters in the Western Cape. Contact will be made with chapter leaders. We pray that 2026 will see people taking classes, receiving their healing, getting restoration, and freedom to serve the Lord optimally.

2025 ends with some contacts made for ministry in eSwatini, a radio outreach programme which will possibly lead to reaching the whole of the African continent with the healing and restoration message of our Lord, and strengthening the capacity of those who are already showing interest in the SaveOne initiative in other parts of the continent. More work WILL be done in the Gauteng province, but we are praying for the Free State, Mpumalanga, Limpopo, KZN and Lesotho where we have made good contact with some churches already.

The 2025 International SaveOne conference was a call for deeper commitment of all chapters, awareness of the urgency of the call, deeper



revelation of the potency of what the Lord has placed in our hands as a global movement and the greatness of the reward for those who have heeded and will continue to heed the call. Above all else, it was the precious promise of our Lord that if we remain in Him, He will keep us completely in His presence and “under the armor” for protection against all hostilities. In the speed of the prophet Elijah, we shall run faster than the chariots and do exploits for His eternal Kingdom.

We thank all who keep us in prayer, support us with their substance, and supported the call to finance my trip to the global conference within a very short time. Rea leboha! Siyabonga! Thank you very much indeed!

I trust that the following few pages will provide a useful update and encourage you to keep walking with us on this important journey. On behalf of the SaveOne SA team, let me wish all of you a Merry Christmas and a Blessed New Year! Let us LOVE LIFE together.

## 2. Ministry Activities 2025

Before outlining the annual activities, we will summarise the key aspects of the content of the outreaches, to prevent unnecessary repetition or excessive detail in the outline.

SaveOne's mission is to help families recover from negative effects of intentional abortion. This means that our core ministry begins post abortion. HOWEVER, we are very keen and remain committed to prevention where possible.

We have noticed that there is a general blanket approach to youth outreach programmes where all youth are assumed to ENGAGE IN SEX AS AND WHEN THEY WANT IT. This assumption is problematic in that those who are determined to abstain do NOT generally get support and encouragement to keep their stance. They get ridiculed for being OLD FASHIONED and OUT OF TOUCH WITH REALITY. They might even be bullied. In instances where they should falter and have sex, they are ridiculed, judged harshly, or condemned. This is one of the reasons why some of them will choose abortion because of shame. Health/lifestyle and other community outreach messages should cover both sections of the population in all circumstances so that all learners, young people, and young adults are comfortable with their choices. We realise that this is a long, complex discussion which deserves a workshop. Here we are specifically commenting in terms of abortion decision, supporting our prolife stance and accepting the individual prochoice approach. Our God is prochoice BUT He makes it clear that each choice HAS CONSEQUENCES. He is also one hundred percent prolife and pleading with us to choose life. We realise that the consequences aspect of the discussion is frowned upon and interpreted as coercion. But that is the space we want to tread in unashamedly, with love, courage, and faith that our youth will choose wisely, and that those who choose differently will still feel comfortable coming back to us for healing and restoration when they discover the truth that was shared with them before the abortion. Namely, that negative effects are possible and painful. It is clear then, that those who appear to (or are not ready to face their decisions) have NO issues after abortion, are NOT our candidates, where the SaveOne curriculum is concerned.

We are grateful for every opportunity we are given to address youth and young adults before they get sexually active or pregnant, and while they are contemplating abortion. We apply much care so that our messages are relevant and appropriately placed according to age and other variables of our target groups. The most basic foundational message, in most cases, has to do with purpose/dreams/aspirations. Once people have clarified their purpose or a need to find one, the next stage is to identify possible building blocks or positive steps towards achieving such as well as possible distractions. Discussions are formulated around concepts like character matters, peer pressure, power of decision making, choices and consequences, discipline to carry through the decisions, benefits of such delayed gratification, importance of support groups, and the importance of making our voice heard on social media and other available communication platforms. The world needs to hear and know that all over the world, in all aspects of life, including sexual behaviour and related matters, people choose differently. They all deserve to know all about what they choose. Isn't that what happens with the packaging of tobacco, fast foods etc., aren't there disclaimers and millions of articles and continuing research initiatives on such?

In places of worship, religious organisations, neutral spaces, or wherever invited to, we dig deep into scriptures, engaging and applying different relevant texts. We have noticed that most presentations from elsewhere assume uniformity of the groups where matters of sexuality are concerned. For example, it is generally assumed that all young people are sexually active or want to be. So, the sexuality talks/presentations to this group are generally on the use of contraceptives and the availability of abortion. Talks to encourage those who may not be sexually active are not common. They might even be viewed as unreasonable, naïve, irrelevant, illusive and a waste of time.

We believe that our talks are inclusive, wholesome, and balanced. We speak the truth based on medical/biological/scientific, and reality.

We do our best to empower our target groups to choose well in life; negotiate and navigate their life based on the universal value principles, Biblical principles (where applicable), and not public opinions, which may not serve/benefit them.

In terms of those who are contemplating abortion, our message is on the importance of making an informed decision. Has the candidate thought clearly and enough about their choice? Have they considered possible side effects, physical, mental, moral, and emotional aspects? These are the things that lead to devastation after the abortion, **EVEN WHEN ONE HAS THOUGHT ABOUT THEM**. How much more when they have not been given a thought at all?

We have relevant and correctly placed approaches for our various target groups.

We share honest and transparent information about the possible aftermath, quoting from thousands of testimonies of people who tell their stories of brokenness and recovery, as well as those who did not live to tell all of their stories.

We present the activity report below, mentioning only some specific information and highlighting aspects of the content mentioned above.

## **2.1 Schools and institutions of higher learning.**

Three High Schools, one university campus and one FET College were visited. We followed up with two pregnancy centers and two young couples who decided to keep their pregnancy. We have also managed to keep in touch with our past class attendees.

### **2.1.1 Mpilisweni Math, Science and ICT School of Specialisation (MSI SOS)**

We addressed learners of all classes except the matriculants (grade 12 learners), who were seemingly engaged in some pre-examination preparations.

In one of the classrooms, our team spoke after a presentation by a nurse who presented the importance of contraceptives. One of her points was that contraceptives are not always protective, so learners can still fall pregnant and/or contract sexually transmitted diseases. The presentation presented an opportunity for a useful follow-up discussion of error-proof alternatives, which are abstinence and being faithful (from the ABC strategy). The ABC strategy was also surrounded and enhanced by initiatives like

*True Love Waits* and *Choose To Wait*, which have not gained much acceptance from some of the youth but are adhered to by many.

### **2.1.2 Ekurhuleni West TVET College**

We were invited to do a presentation to students in one sitting. However, on arrival, it was clear that the logistics had not gone as planned. Our team decided to go along with what was available and possible, so we spent some time with students on the college park/lawn, discussing issues of abortion and related subjects, and sharing contact details and pamphlets where we could.

### **2.1.3 Tshwane University Of Technology (TUT) Soshanguve Campus**

The Soshanguve campus of TUT invited us to the health awareness day. We had the opportunity to follow up with our not-so-new mother of a boy child who was born in November 2024.

We ministered on a public loudspeaker to the student and staff community, as well as other vendors like ourselves, sharing the vision and mission of SaveOne. Some of the peer educators and staff spent time with us at our table. The TUT media team also visited us and recorded an interview with us.

## **2.2 Remote Ministry**

We continue to check on our past and continue to be there for our current candidates electronically, trusting the Lord for complete healing of the same.

## **2.3 Training of facilitators**

Three churches have had training of facilitators.

## **2.4 Community/partners follow-up**

Two pregnancy centres in Gauteng were visited, with the delivery of some stuff for the centres. We delivered some clothing items donated by our sister NPO Lintle Community Awakening

## **2.5 Fountain of Love children's home**

One of the children's homes in Katlehong sent us a request for food. While we did not have any food to give, we reached out to Global Aid Network, who were kind enough to share some food with our beneficiaries.

## **2.6 Durban new mother follow-up in February, April, and briefly in December.**

We had three visits with our new mother in Durban. She was a student at TUT. During all the visits, we were blessed to share a little support for the baby. Both the mother and father of the baby were seen during all the visits.

## **2.7 New relationships**

Even though our current capacity speaks differently, we keep knocking on the doors of a few more churches in Pretoria for 2026, as we believe they are strategically placed for the SaveOne Curriculum. Two city High Schools have been earmarked for the new year. We were able to visit one of them just

before the end of the year, encouraging matriculants to focus on their examination preparation and keep focus on their dreams by making clever choices.

## **2.8 Youth Link Camp**

One of our campus ministry team members was able to represent SaveOne at a three-day youth camp in the North of Pretoria. The camp addressed abstinence by presenting the concept of CHOOSE TO WAIT and also applying oneself to thinking before acting, as one's actions have generational impact, whether it be positive or negative. This enabled our team member to position:

- Impact of our choices
- The legalisation of abortion in South Africa and its implications on society.
- The role of both parties, male and female, in the decision to keep the pregnancy or abort.
- What SaveOne stands for
- The nature of support given by SaveOne

Out of this camp, we believe a firm relationship has been formed with Bethel Family Church and Word of Hope International Ministries. It is our prayer that the relationship will lead to the formation of SaveOne chapters.

## **3. Lesotho**

### **3.1 Scripture Union (SU) of Lesotho**

At the beginning of November, the SU tertiary associates held their annual meeting at the Scripture Union Centre in Maseru. SaveOne ministry was introduced, and a proposal was made for the Union to consider adopting the SaveOne curriculum as they work with young people and children.

Three members of the management board of the SU met with the Khauoes in December, where various matters were discussed. Once again, the SaveOne curriculum was discussed.

### **3.2 Soulwinning Outreach Ministries, Maseru, Lesotho**

SaveOne was briefly introduced at this church during a Sunday service. We are pleased that the leadership has expressed interest in adopting the SaveOne curriculum.

### **3.3 Occupy Till I Come Ministries**

An introductory presentation was made during a single ladies' conference in December.

### **3.4 Harvest FM**

The last activity of the year was an opportunity on Harvest FM in Lesotho. The interview focused on the possible negative effects of intentional abortion. Following up on the interview, listeners sent WhatsApp messages to the host. Of the responses which could be accommodated by the time slot, (+- 50 listeners responded), twelve were from men who were devastated by abortion without their consent. Three ladies mentioned that they had agreed with their partners to abort, but following the abortion, the partners took a very bad turn of anger, blaming them (the ladies) for the abortion and ending the relationship, leaving the ladies to deal with the aftermath on their own.

## 4. SaveOne International Conference

Here, I (Mpho Masienyane-Khauoe) have taken the liberty to be personal and narrate some details of the conference, in almost a similar manner that our parents narrated stories to us in the evenings, to instill values and moral uprightness in us when we were very young 😊.

I had the privilege of attending the 2025 SaveOne International Conference. After thanking God for everything, I thank all friends and family who yielded to the prompting of the Lord and contributed their finances, making it possible for me to travel.

The conference took place in Nashville, Tennessee, on October 16-18. The venue was Family Worship Center in Murfreesboro, TN. About 100/120 candidates attended from some of the states in the USA. SaveOne Europe (2), Canada (2), and South Africa (1) was also represented.

When the conference was announced together with the cost thereof, I could not see any possibility of attendance due to financial capabilities and the number of other matters of priority that were, and still are, waiting for finance to get appropriate attention. After a few “fleece” moments, a decision was taken that I should attend. Fundraising was clearly not successful until we had to take a step of faith. Just ten days before my due date for flying out, a WhatsApp message was sent out to just below 100 people or so. 32 people responded. 20 sent money immediately, and 12 made promises. At the point of writing this report, three promises have materialised.

I arrived in Nashville on Wednesday 15th, late afternoon. I could not resist the offer to fellowship with the brethren at the Cornerstone Assemblies of God, the home of the SaveOne Global, Pastors Jack and Sheila Harper. This was an amazing experience. I felt like I was home! I felt and related to the roots of SaveOne intimately. I still cannot explain the feeling. I knew for sure that SaveOne was my ultimate purpose on this side of eternity. Reassuring peace and calm captured and overwhelmed me.

During the service, I noticed a certain brother who was very actively/intimately involved with worship, the sermon, etc. Just responding to the service offering beautifully and, in the process, connecting with me in an amazing manner. I later discovered that he was the husband of our dear Sonya Willey, the admin whizz at the SaveOne office. 😊 What a fellowship.

Part of the teaching that evening was how God orchestrates events leading to a fulfillment of His purpose on earth. I saw how He had worked things behind the curtains for me to be involved with SaveOne, and now to be just a few hours away from attending the conference.

I am aware of the Samaritan Purse ministry which facilitates the Operation Christmas Child (OCC) which is active in South Africa. It was amazing to see how the ministry is made possible by different churches. Some empty OCC boxes were packed neatly at the entrance of the Cornerstone Assembly. Brethren were reminded to take the empty boxes and return them to church with goodies. From here, the boxes are returned to the OCC initiative organisers who then distribute them to various parts of the world including our own South Africa as gifts for those children who need to see the love of God during the Christmas period.

Arriving at the venue on Thursday, the 16th, was another experience. Meeting the vision-bearers Sheila and Jack felt unreal...like a dream. Then there was Kristy Hall, who, together with her husband are the SaveOne international ministry coordinator, Sonya (admin), and Chris Willey, Michelle Thomas from Canada (who had blessed us with her presence in 2024 in South Africa), and Dina Davenport, the SaveOne prayer coordinator, with whom I had communicated by email before....Arnold Culbreath and his beautiful wife, Babra. (I had met Arnold in one of the podcasts)...and of course, all the new faces I met and loved. Just seeing the goodness of God upon all of us! It was an overwhelming feeling. A dream was just unfolding in my presence. I did not want to get out of it.

Our participation in the SaveOne International Conference provided valuable opportunities for learning, networking, and ministry growth.

#### **4.1 Lessons that I learned:**

There are matters which might be “obvious” during discussion, but to observe them and see them in real time is another matter.

1. The Church is indeed a champion of SaveOne in the USA. I observed with admiration how the local church has bought into the SaveOne mission, implementing and supporting the vision as its own. SaveOne activity is completely part of the services offered by the local church. The SaveOne team is indeed one of the teams, as would be the counselling team, children’s ministry, etc. SaveOne notices are on the notice boards together with others. SaveOne is blessed to contribute towards a caring, loving, restorative church of our Lord Jesus, who said NEITHER DO I CONDEMN YOU. GO, AND SIN NO MORE. The Great Shepherd who leaves the ninety-nine to go seek the one lost.
2. One does NOT need to have had an abortion to be an effective minister in the healing classes. All one needs is the heart and grace to be involved.
3. Variety, diversity, or difference is a strength. It is NOT a competition. Each one is called to do something similar, and/but differently. We can ALL work together for the Kingdom, even when we do the same thing, approaching it differently. All the vendors at the conference spoke directly to the question of abortion, just differently, tackling a different angle.
4. Networking and collaborative relationships. The climax of collaboration and networks was (for me) the presence of one of the lawyers who fought for the overturning of the Roe v. Wade case by the U.S. Supreme Court. The lesson I picked here is that testimonies are powerful. They are a force. Women documented their testimonies and allowed them to be used to show that abortion does NOT go well for ALL who do it. The aftermath is traumatic, and the world needs to know. These testimonies helped in the court ruling. SaveOne office reported that following the overturning of Roe v. Wade, the number of people seeking healing increased significantly, showing that more people began to open up about their reality, as a result of more open discussions and awareness of possible/available help/support.

All the vendors who displayed their ministries at the summit were supportive. They each focus on subjects that are directly related to abortion. They portrayed diversity of like-minded ministries coming together in power and strength to protect the sanctity of life and dignity, facilitating healing of those who are broken and loving them back to their original life purpose ordained by their Creator.

The set-up was beautiful, dignified, professional, and very welcoming. People were kind and loving. The worship was intimate. I immediately felt that it was good that I attended. I learned much just from observation and experiencing the love and fellowship with people who themselves have received much from the God of grace and are willing to be vessels of calling others into the same freedom they shared in Jesus. The community appreciated seeing a person from South Africa, the newest regional chapter in the room.

The dinner was great. Very different from our SA dinners, which are also great! I saw that things do not have to be the same to be enjoyed.

## **5. Programme Highlights and Personal Reflections**

The programme offered a wealth of meaningful content and experiences. To provide our supporters with a comprehensive understanding of the summit, I have attached several documents for further reading. These materials will provide a broader picture of the presentations. However, I would like to share my personal reflections on a few of the presentations that particularly stood out to me before concluding my account. Let me begin by appreciating the availability of statistics in the USA. It makes work more meaningful and measures progress or lack of it appropriately. In South Africa we are yet to get such.

### **5.1 Allan E Parker Jr's presentation**

This presentation had a profound impact on me. He highlighted the significance of sharing our stories about the wounds caused by abortion, emphasising that these testimonies are powerful tools in God's hands. In a world where the narrative often asserts that abortion is in the best interest of women—ignoring the deep pain and misery endured by millions who have made this choice—Allan reminded us of the importance and the impact of truth-telling.

Many women, having chosen abortion as a perceived solution to a problem, challenge, or unwanted distraction, later come to realise that this choice did not bring the relief or resolution they hoped for. Instead, it often led to further suffering. It was the honest and courageous testimonies of these women that ultimately contributed to the historic reversal of *Roe v. Wade* in the Supreme Court of the United States, empowering individual states to make their own decisions regarding abortion.

The presentation resonated deeply with the beliefs of everyone involved with SaveOne. It affirmed our collective prayers grounded in God's Word, the values we uphold, and our shared mission to make abortion unthinkable. However, I recognise that our stance and the truths we share may sometimes be misunderstood by those who support abortion, who might perceive them as condemnation and coercion, rather than concern on the one side, and on the other side, those who see us as sinners who encourage people to abort, knowing that they will be loved and supported.

My heartfelt plea is for others to see our ministry for what it truly is: an expression of genuine love and deep concern for all. We are not here to judge or condemn—how could we, when so many of us have experienced the same pain and have bled from similar wounds? Our desire is to offer compassion and hope, standing alongside those who are hurting, and to extend the same grace we have received.

## **5.2 Brad Mattes' Presentation**

### *Understanding the Impact of DIY Abortion*

Brad Mattes' presentation on the coverup surrounding the abortion pill was particularly compelling and deeply troubling. He shed light on the painful reality that the availability of the abortion pill has made it possible for women to carry out abortions themselves at home, outside of medical supervision. This shift means that the trauma of the abortion experience is no longer confined to medical facilities; instead, it enters the home, directly affecting not only the woman but also her family members, who may witness or become involved in the process. The home, therefore, becomes the site of the abortion, and the memories associated with the event linger both in the minds of the woman and her loved ones.

### *Hidden Dangers and Coverups*

One of the most alarming aspects highlighted was the potential for the abortion pill to be administered without a woman's knowledge or consent. This opens the door for its misuse by traffickers, paedophiles, abusive partners, and even some parents, all of whom may exploit this method for their own purposes. Additionally, some abortion providers reportedly classify chemical abortions as miscarriages to conceal the true statistics, further contributing to the cover-up and obscuring the reality of the situation.

### *Hope in the Reversal of Chemical Abortion*

Despite these challenging realities, the presentation also offered hope. Brad Mattes shared that chemical abortions can be successfully reversed if the reversal protocol is initiated within 24 hours after taking the first dose of the abortion pill. The first pill works by blocking progesterone, a hormone essential for sustaining pregnancy, but prompt intervention with the reversal protocol can restore the pregnancy's progression.

## **5.3 A Call for Responsible Advertising**

This presentation brought to mind the reckless nature of abortion advertising in our own country. It is my sincere conviction that the way abortion is marketed and advertised requires urgent attention and regulation. Products such as tobacco, alcohol, and infant formula include disclaimers warning of potential dangers (albeit in small print), yet abortion services do not carry similar warnings. This disparity highlights the need for greater accountability and transparency in how abortion is presented to the public.

## **5.4 The Growth and Impact of SaveOne**

The programme was enriching from its very outset, setting the tone for the entire event. Hearing Sheila share the story of SaveOne was a particularly moving experience—it felt fresh and inspiring, even though I had heard it before. Her account reinforced for me the profound truth that God's assignments and works often begin in small, seemingly insignificant ways, but when faithfully pursued, they are destined to grow and flourish.

The journey from having no chapters at all to now exceeding 400 chapters is nothing short of remarkable. This achievement did not come easily; it is the result of persistent effort and dedication from ordinary individuals, empowered by their faith in a supernatural God. Each chapter represents countless lives touched and transformed, and the growth so far is both humbling and motivating.

## 6. Visit to the office

What an inspiration this was! I was fascinated by this picture below. I realised that it really had been a great campaign when SA was being planned for in 2024. We will hold this memory precious in our hearts. We pray that every effort, every prayer, every word of encouragement, and all the support for SA will be worth it in the end. ## 7. Visit to the home of the Harpers

### 7.1 The Team

I could name all the staff members, but the truth is that we all appreciated each other, and the love was all over as we committed to running with all our might in the next five years.

### 7.2 The Fellowship: Under Armour

### 7.3 The Prayer

We had the privilege of being prayed for one by one. At the request of Sheila, Jeff Gregory, president of

the SaveOne board, took time to pray for all the staff individually, allowing the Lord to minister a word to each one of us. I will live to see the fruition of the word that was spoken over me where this ministry is concerned.

#### **7.4 The Charge**

Sheila shared the following scriptures, which the Lord laid on her heart: 1 Kings 18:46, as she gave the charge.

##### **Context:**

Psalm 102:5-9

##### **Where abortion left most of us**

Verse 5 says, *“Because of my loud groaning my bones cling to my flesh.*

*6 I am like a desert owl of the wilderness, like an owl of the waste places;*

*7 I lie awake; I am like a lonely sparrow on the housetop. (This is what happens to most of us after the abortion)*

*8 All the day my enemies taunt me; (remember all those stray emotions and self-destruction behaviours we suffered?) those who deride me use my name for a curse.*

*9 For I eat ashes like bread and mingle tears with my drink.”*

Sheila writes, This is pretty much what so many of us lived after our abortion experience. And there are so many more out there who are living in this state of being.

##### **Does God care about this situation? A big YES**

Verse 18-20- *“Let this be recorded for a generation to come, so that a people yet to be created may praise the Lord:*

*19 that he looked down from His holy height; from heaven the Lord looked at the earth,*

*20 to hear the groans of the prisoners, to set free those who were doomed to die,*

##### **Can this situation change? A big YES**

Verse 20: God looks to the earth to **set the prisoners free**

##### **Final message: 100 Chapters per year for the next five years.**

When God showed Sheila the target numbers, she doubted because of the perceived “slow progress in the past. But God was not silent. He responded immediately:

1 Kings 18:46 New Living Translation (NLT)

*Then the hand of the LORD came upon Elijah [giving him supernatural strength]. He girded up his loins and outran Ahab to the entrance of Jezreel.*

Beloved, we go NOT in our own strength. We go in His name who gives supernatural strength and ALSO requires us to rest in Him, understanding that the work is His, He who rested after six days of creation. He now requires us to rest in Him and allow Him to rejuvenate our bodies so that we are strong enough to run further and effectively. He who said “all authority has been given to me,

He who said “all authority has been given to me, **THEREFORE GO! LET US GO. LET US RUN AHEAD OF THE CHARIOTS. LET US ENGAGE. THIS IS OUR MOMENT OF SUPERNATURAL ACCELERATION.** The fields are ready for harvest. Pray therefore for the Lord of the harvest to send faithful workers in the fields. May our prayer be, **LORD SEND MORE WORKERS IN THE FIELD. BEGIN WITH ME!**

**The vision is clear and absolutely compelling. The mission for the next 5 years is out!**

We are to start chapters and support each chapter as they fulfill their call. Remember that in SaveOne, the Church of Christ IS the champion! Sheila says, “I picture every chapter being a lighthouse for someone and the more lighthouses we create in communities, the quicker we will build this army of truth tellers and become the loudest voice in the fight for LIFE....”

Thank you, Sheila, for heeding the call. In your vision, we have found our purpose.

Following the conference, I had a meaningful time with our international coordinators, Tim and Kristy Hall. Timothy, in his soft voice said to me at the end of our time, “do you think we could get 100 chapters from South Africa?”. A few seconds of what I believed was an assuring endorsement whisper from the Lord, I nodded. This was a deep moment for me. Even as I write, tears fill my eyes. I remember how He assured Peter “*But I have prayed for you, Simon, that your faith may not fail. And when you have turned back, strengthen your brothers.*” *Didn’t I minister to you through your brother, my servant Jeff Gregory too? Behold I am with you .*

**And so, South Africa, lets us ARISE. 100 chapters it is from our deep beautiful South region. Let us hold hands and GO. Remember that He is the God who is “able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us.” Ephesians 3:20.**
